BUCHAREST - LANDMARKS

Bucharest boasts a rich tapestry of historical and cultural landmarks that reflect its diverse heritage.

- Palace of the Parliament: Dominating the city's skyline, the Palace of the Parliament is the world's heaviest and third-largest administrative building. Constructed during the 1980s under Nicolae Ceauşescu's regime, this colossal structure exemplifies socialist realist architecture and houses the Romanian Parliament, as well as several museums.
- Romanian Athenaeum: An architectural gem, the Romanian Athenaeum
 is a concert hall renowned for its exquisite neoclassical design and
 exceptional acoustics. Since its completion in 1888, it has been a symbol
 of Romanian culture, hosting numerous classical music performances
 and serving as the home of the George Enescu Philharmonic Orchestra.
- Old Town (Lipscani District): The historic heart of Bucharest, the
 Lipscani District, showcases a blend of medieval, neoclassical, and Art
 Nouveau architecture. Once a major commercial hub, today its narrow
 cobblestone streets are lined with vibrant cafés, restaurants, shops, and
 historic landmarks, reflecting the city's rich past.
- **Dimitrie Gusti National Village Museum**: Situated within Herăstrău Park, this open-air museum offers an immersive journey into Romania's rural heritage. Established in 1936, it features traditional houses, churches, and farmsteads relocated from various regions, providing insight into the country's diverse architectural styles and folk traditions.
- Stavropoleos Monastery: Nestled in the Old Town, Stavropoleos Monastery is a serene oasis renowned for its stunning Brâncovenesc architecture. Established in 1724, the monastery features intricate stone and wood carvings, a beautiful courtyard, and houses a valuable collection of religious artifacts and books.
- Arcul de Triumf: Inspired by Paris's Arc de Triomphe, Bucharest's Arcul
 de Triumf commemorates Romania's military victories and the Great
 Union of 1918. Erected in its current form in 1936, the 27-meter-high
 monument is adorned with sculptures by prominent Romanian artists
 and stands as a symbol of national pride.
- Cotroceni Palace: Serving as the official residence of the Romanian President, Cotroceni Palace is a splendid example of neo-Romanian architecture. The palace complex also houses the National Cotroceni Museum, which showcases Romanian art, history, and culture within its opulent interiors.



BUCHAREST - LANDMARKS (CONT'D) ●

Herăstrău Park: Covering over 180 hectares in northern Bucharest,
Herăstrău Park is the city's largest park, encompassing a sizable lake,
expansive green spaces, and numerous recreational facilities. It's a
popular destination for boating, picnicking, and cultural events, offering a
refreshing escape from the urban ble.

- Cişmigiu Gardens: As the city's oldest public park, established in 1847,
 Cişmigiu Gardens offers a tranquil retreat in the heart of Bucharest.
 Spanning approximately 14.6 hectares, the park features winding alleys,
 a picturesque lake, and diverse flora, making it a favorite spot for both
 locals and visitors seeking relaxation amidst nature.
- Revolution Square: A site of profound historical significance, Revolution Square was the epicenter of the 1989 Romanian Revolution that led to the fall of the communist regime. The square is surrounded by notable buildings, including the former Royal Palace, now the National Museum of Art, and is marked by the Memorial of Rebirth, honoring those who fought for freedom.
- National Museum of Art of Romania: Situated in the former Royal Palace on Revolution Square, the National Museum of Art of Romania is home to the country's most extensive art collection. Featuring Romanian medieval and modern artworks alongside impressive European masterpieces, the museum reflects Romania's rich artistic heritage.
- People's Salvation Cathedral: Also known as the National Cathedral, this monumental Orthodox church is one of the tallest and largest in the world. 

ROMANIAN CASH REBATE

General Guidelines:

• 30% rebate on qualifying Romanian spend as long as all invoices are coming from a taxable Romanian company or individual.

- 30% rebate on EU labor working in Romania (i.e., all UK/EU cast and crew) so long as they pay statutory withholding tax, provide any required documentation, and are contracted and paid directly by the Romanian production company.
- There is a minimum spend requirement of EUR 100,000/project.
- There is a EUR 10 million cap on the amount of incentive given per project.
- The incentive is a cash back rebate. There are no discounts/fees/taxes/ middleman costs.
- Reimbursment may be bundled up with other state aid for audiovisual works at up to 60% intensity for cross border productions involving more than one EU member state

Non-Qualifying Costs:

- Foreign cast and crew per diem.
- Non EU cast and crew labor.
- Rentals and purchases from outside of Romania.
- Food receipts (catering/craft on set is acceptable).
- Development, distribution, publicity and marketing cost.
- Customs duties.
- Bank fees.
- VAT
- Air travel costs where Romania is not start or end point.

Application Stages:

- 1. Submitting the Application for Registration The Application for Registration must be submitted to the OFIC together with the necessary documentation before starting work on the project.
- 2. Submission of the Funding Application Once the project has been implemented, the applicant must submit an Application for Funding, together with the necessary documentation. Applications may be submitted no later than November 1, 2026.
- **3. Submitting an Application** The Applicant must submit the Request for Payment within 9 months after the signature of the Financing Agreement, but no later than November 1, 2028.

Cultural Test:

- Each project must pass the EU mandated cultural test.
- Each project must attain a minimum of 18 out 49 points



SHOT IN ROMANIA

Django (2023) series

Set in the Old West of the 1860s–1870s, it follows Django as he searches for his daughter in a town called New Babylon. Filmed extensively in Romania, including locations such as Bucharest and the Danube area, the series showcases the country's versatile landscapes and historical settings.

We Were The Lucky Ones (2023) series

A 2024 limited series that chronicles the harrowing journey of the Polish-Jewish Kurc family during World War II, as they strive to survive and reunite amidst the Holocaust. Bucharest served as a primary filming location, standing in for several Polish cities, including Radom and Lvov (now Lviv, Ukraine). The city's early 20th-century architecture provided an authentic backdrop for the series' historical setting.

Wednesday (2022) series

Directed by Tim Burton, this Netflix series featuring Wednesday Addams was shot extensively at Cantacuzino Castle in Buşteni and other Romanian sites. Romania's gothic-style architecture contributed significantly to the series' darkly whimsical aesthetic.

Flowers in the Attic (2022) series

This Lifetime prequel series to the iconic "Flowers in the Attic" saga was filmed extensively in Romania, leveraging historic mansions and period architecture to recreate the opulent yet haunting atmosphere central to the story's dramatic narrative.

Directed by Neil Burger, this sci-fi thriller starring Colin Farrell and Tye Sheridan used Romanian studio facilities and locations to craft its futuristic spaceship interiors and environments, highlighting the country's advanced production capabilities.

Directed by Todd Phillips and starring Jonah Hill and Miles Teller, parts of this dark comedy-drama were filmed in Bucharest and other Romanian locales, effectively doubling for Albania and other international settings to realistically depict its global arms-dealing story.

Sons of Liberty (2015) series

This historical miniseries set during the American Revolution, featuring actors like Ben Barnes, utilized Romanian locations and sets to convincingly portray 18th-century colonial America.

The Zero Theorem (2013) feature film

Directed by Terry Gilliam and starring Christoph Waltz, this futuristic sci-fi drama filmed in Bucharest, leveraging the city's eclectic architecture and gritty urban landscapes to visualize Gilliam's surreal, dystopian vision.

Hatfields & McCoys (2012) series

This Emmy-winning historical miniseries starring Kevin Costner and Bill Paxton depicted the infamous American family feud using Romanian locations to authentically represent late-1800s Kentucky and West Virginia, highlighting Romania's versatility as a filming location.

The Brothers Bloom (2008) feature film

Directed by Rian Johnson, this clever comedy-drama featuring Adrien Brody, Mark Ruffalo, and Rachel Weisz was partly shot at the stunning Peleş Castle in Sinaia which perfectly captured the film's whimsical European elegance.

Cold Mountain (2003) feature film

Directed by Anthony Minghella, this Civil War epic starring Nicole Kidman and Jude Law used Romania's Carpathian Mountains as a convincing substitute for 19th-century rural North Carolina. Romania's lush landscapes and authentic villages provided a believable American frontier backdrop.


